

# Please note change of day for netball; Netball club will be held on a Tuesday not a Wednesday

If you have not already done so please sign your child up as places are filling up fast! As you know from the letter sent over the summer period, the school currently has a deficit budget. As a result, this year we will be asking for a nominal fee of £5 to attend each school run club. £5 covers the whole term. Most clubs are likely to run for around 12 sessions per term. A nominal fee has been preferred over weekly charges as it allows for occasional cancellations/illness and keeps the cost to a minimum. Weekly charges would be much higher and create additional administration. Staff give up their free time to run clubs and have agreed they would be happy for all income generated to be directed straight back into the school budget to pay for necessities. Therefore, every £5 paid for a club place directly helps support the children at school. Please sign up for clubs using the links provided (next to each club) as before. You will have a week to pay for the club (using ParentPay) in order confirm your child's place. Any places not paid for after a week will be offered out to children on the waiting list. Clubs will be offered free of charge to pupils in receipt of pupil premium – no payment is required for these children. If you are struggling financially and are unable to pay for a club, please contact the school directly for further advice and support.


