Once you have found a slot that works for you - click 'book'. You will be sent an email from studybugs with a summary of the details of the appointment and reminders 30 minutes and 5 minutes before. Please note that you will still receive an email with a link and reminders even with a face to face appointment.

- Red Nose Day collaborative collage for each class.


We know there's a lot going on right now and for many people things are really tough. But if you can donate, every penny will add up to a life changing difference.

World Book Day

Reminder that we have lots of exciting activities in the build up to World Book Day (Thursday March 7th). On the day, if they wish, children (& staff!) can dress up either in pyjamas or as a book character.

Parking in the Miller & Carter Car Park

The Miller & Carter have contacted us about parents parking in the car park. They state that 'the parents car parking in our carpark is yet again out of control, with no consideration that we are a business and that the carpark is private property.

Today our beer delivery had problems at 8.50am getting into the carpark to deliver our beer and a guest who is disabled could not park in a disabled space due to a parent picking up kids at 3.10pm parking in it. It would be a real shame if the Miller & Carter decide to restrict parking again due to the actions of a few inconsiderate people.
